## Novel ALS drug slows symptom progression, reduces mortality

A new study from Mass General's Neurology Clinical Trials Unit shows that treatment with dexamipexole – a novel drug believed to prevent dysfunction of mitochondria, the subcellular structures that provide most of a cell's energy – appears to slow symptom progression in the neurodegenerative disease amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS), also called Lou Gehrig's disease.
